Brief Bio

Toni Whited is the Michael and Diane Jones Professor of Business Administration at the William E. Simon Graduate School of Business at the University of Rochester, where she teaches courses in finance and econometrics in the MBA and Ph.D. programs. Before joining Rochester this year, she was on the faculty of the School of Business at the University of Wisconsin, most recently as the Kuechenmeister-Bascom professor of finance. She received her B.A. in economics and French, *summa cum laude*, from the University of Oregon in 1984 and her Ph.D. in economics from Princeton in 1990, working with Ben Bernanke. Her research has covered topics such as the effects of financial frictions on corporate investment; econometric solutions for measurement error; corporate cash policy; structural estimation of dynamic capital structure models; and corporate diversification. Her research has twice won a Brattle Prize for one of the top articles in the *Journal of Finance* in corporate finance. She serves on the editorial board of the *Journal of Financial Economics* and the *Journal of Macroeconomics* and was one of the founding co-editors of *Finance Research Letters*.
